Cambridge IVF is the only NHS-run fertility treatment centre in the East of England and is keen to show off its facilities, just as the new NHS funding contract is due to be announced.

Recently, the Chair of Cambridge University Hospitals who runs Cambridge IVF, Jane Ramsey, and the Associate director of Women and Children's Services, Amanda Cahn, were given an in depth tour and explanation of how the unit works. They were shown the purpose-built unit with state-of-the-art laboratory facilities including the reassuring IVF Witness identification system, Primovision's time-lapse [embryo](#) development monitoring system, and the Embryogluce that all patients benefit from at Cambridge IVF to help boost their chances of conception.
